<p>The Decision-Making Structure of CUPE National</p>

Convention

The biannual convention is CUPE's highest authority.

The representation from the locals at the Convention is as follows:

- 100 members or less: 1 delegate;
- between 101 and 200 members: 2 delegates;
- between 201 and 500 members: 3 delegates;
- between 501 and 1,000 members: 4 delegates;

over 1,000 members: for every 500 members or a fraction of this number:
one additional delegate.

National Executive Board

Between Conventions, the National Executive Board is the managing body of CUPE.

It takes the measures and makes the decisions necessary to carry out the decisions and the guidelines of the Convention and to make sure that the provisions of the CUPE Constitution and By-laws are honored.

The National Executive Board is composed of:

- 1 National President;
- 1 Secretary-Treasurer;
- 5 General Vice-Presidents (1 from Quebec);
- 14 Regional Vice-Presidents (2 from Quebec);
- 2 Diversity Vice-Presidents elected at the Convention.

National Executive Committee

The National Executive Committee is responsible for the administration of CUPE's projects and activities and for the development of its policies and programs when the union is not in Convention and when the National Executive Board is not in session.

The National Executive Committee is composed of::

- 1 National President;
- 1 National Secretary-Treasurer;
- 5 General Vice-Presidents (1 from Quebec).
